APPROVAL OF MINUTES

On motion of Commissioner Richardson and seconded by Commissioner Allen and carried, the Minutes of the regular meeting of April 12, 2005 were approved as written.

RECOGNITION OF VISITORS – Chairman Bishop recognized and welcomed Mr. Otis Neil Godbee, retired, Bibb County Sheriff's Office, who was present to receive his retirement resolution and watch. At the request of Chairman Bishop, Vice Chairman Hart read the resolution and made the watch presentation.

Chairman Bishop recognized and welcomed Mr. Pat Topping, Macon Economic Development Commission (MEDC), for presentation of the Ad Boards from the March edition of Georgia Trend Magazine.

Mr. Topping stated that for the last couple of years, the County has partnered with MEDC to help produce an ad to go into the Georgia Trend Magazine. He stated that this magazine is read by more than 45,000 business, education, political leaders, elected officials and economic developers in this state and there are people that need to see what's going on in Macon and Bibb County. Mr. Topping then presented each member of the Board a copy of the ad that ran in the March edition as well as a copy of the magazine. Mr. Topping added that Georgia Trend was the leading business publication in Georgia.

Mr. Topping introduced Mr. Chip Cherry, President, Greater Macon Chamber of Commerce. Mr. Cherry stated that they had a kickoff last week for "Macon NOW!" which is an initiative to enhance their economic development efforts which they funded, largely through private sector contributions and investments, over a five-year period \$2.5 million. He stated that they were off to a great start and had a campaign document drawn up that laid out the case for support for the plan. Mr. Cherry then presented each member of the Board a copy of same. In closing, Mr. Cherry thanked the Board for the great partnership they've enjoyed and stated that they wouldn't be able to do what they do without the Board's support.

<u>FINANCE</u>, <u>TAX AND REVENUE COMMITTEE</u> - Committee Chairman Hart reported the following:

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF BIBB COUNTY, GEORGIA AUTHORIZING THE CHAIRMAN TO SIGN DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO CONVEY THE BIBB COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER TO THE URBAN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY SO THAT BIBB COUNTY CAN THEREAFTER LEASE SAID LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER BACK FROM THE URBAN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE SERIES 2005 TAX EXEMPT ADJUSTABLE MODE REVENUE BONDS TO BE ISSUED BY SAID AUTHORITY.

- 4. **FOR INFORMATION ONLY** With regards to the request of Mr. Christopher Rein, Sardis Plantation Homeowners' Association that large font street signs be installed in his neighborhood, the Committee reports that the County is not installing the larger street markers at interior subdivision intersections at this time, but that the matter will be addressed in the future.
- 5. **FOR INFORMATION ONLY** With regards to the letter from Ms. Edna Galloway requesting that a traffic study be performed at the intersection of Houston Road and Sardis Church/Walden Roads, the Committee reports that the study has been completed indicating that a traffic signal is warranted and the County is in the process of formulating a cost estimate.

Oglesby, Houston Engineering, Inc. of approval of three variances for the proposed Lochwolde Subdivision be approved subject to the right-of-way remaining at 55 foot back to the first intersection off of Price Road and Thomaston Road.
